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Mihintale Katu Seya

It is believed that this sthupa was built by enshrining the equipment such as tools that were used to construct the Mihintale Monastic Complex. This has been identified as "Katu Seya" which is mentioned in a slab inscription of King Mihindu IV. It mentions that the lands offered to this sthupa must managed by the officers who took care of Eth Vehera. The time of construction of this sthupa can not be mentioned definitely and it can be assumed that it was constructed after the ancient temple complex was built at Mihintale. The bottom part of the Katu Seya which is small in size is built with granite and the upper part has been constructed with bricks. In the year 1941 this has been declared a protected monument by the Archaeological Department.

Furthermore, in an excavation conducted in the early 19th century of area around the sthupa, copper plates with inscriptions of the Mahayana Sutra verses in Sanskrit and Sinhala written between the 8th and 9th century had been discovered from the site. The evidence gleaned from the architectural features of the Sthupa centered monastic complex of the Mahayana tradition has established that it belonged to the Anuradhapura period.

Professor Diyanath Samarasinghe was Awarded Doctor of Science (*Honoris causa*) at the 17th convocation of RUSL



Prof. Diyanath Samarasinghe, well-known scholar, researcher and educator was awarded an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Science, at the 17th General Convocation of the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka.

Dr. Samarasinghe is a graduate of the Faculty of Medicine, Colombo. Soon after graduating he joined its staff as a Lecturer, in 1976. His postgraduate training in Psychiatry in the UK while the Membership of the Royal College of Psychiatrists (MRCPsy., UK), and Diploma in Psychological Medicine (DPM, UK) the Licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians (LRCP, UK) and Member of the Royal College of Surgeons (MRCS, England). He was made a Fellow of the Royal College of Psychiatrists (FRCPsy, UK) in 1999. He has also been elected a Fellow of the Sri Lanka College of Physicians and a Fellow of the Sri Lanka College of Psychiatrists.

He was the pioneer in initiating the B.Sc. degree program in Health Promotion, the first in the South East Asian region at the Faculty of Applied Sciences, Rajarata University of Sri Lanka in 2006.

At the request of the faculty, he made a huge effort to set up the Health Promotion degree course, spearheading the drafting of the curriculum and by-laws and supporting the teaching of students until the graduation of the special degree students of the first batch. The fieldwork component of this Health Promotion degree programme, almost entirely designed by him, is unique. Its success has already attracted the attention of many foreign universities in countries including Sweden, Japan, Nigeria, Singapore, Myanmar and Australia, who send their students to the Faculty of Applied Sciences. His model of wellbeing development has been the key for developing the “community based health promotion approach” introduced by the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka.

Introduction of New Course Flora of Ceylon Aiming to Improve Capacity on Conservation and Utilization of the Floral Resources of Sri Lanka



A newly designed, revised and approved course for Applied Biology students was started for the first time in Rajarata University by Dr Asanga Wijetunga [Lecturer (Probationary)] in this year; with the aim to review the knowledge on the vegetation types of Sri Lanka, their physiognomy, structure, floristic composition, intrinsic values, conservation and management issues, sustainable utilization of the resources and services of the island's forests and flora with the intention of giving a better inspiration for the high diversity of the forest biota and the increasing threats on them.

Field practical classes of this course will be conducted in Sinharaja Forest Reserve (3 days, residential), Horton Plains and Giritale-Minneria National Parks (two day outs) to study the rich flora and their association with fauna. Vegetation in and around the Rajarata University will be studied extensively to learn about Dry Zone flora of the area. Twenty five

regular second year students have been registered for the course and additionally three senior biology students and one health promotion student are also following the lectures and practical sessions to gain knowledge on Sri Lankan Flora.



Faculty of Applied Sciences Conducted Workshops on A/L Practical Skills to Improve Education North Central Province

Faculty of Applied Sciences organized a workshop for GCE Advanced Level students from schools of North Central Province with the aim of elevating standards of Advanced Level education in the area. This workshop focused on laboratory component of physics, chemistry, biology, ICT, mathematics and technology streams that students must master. Advanced Level students were given the opportunity to interactively practice on practical and laboratory equipment recommended in the A/L syllabus within laboratories under the supervision of academic staff and students. These practical skills are vital in achieving higher grades in A/L exam but majority of students from this area face difficulties due to either poorly equipped laboratories or lack of teachers. This workshop was initiated to address those issues in year 2007 and continuing since then as one of the main community events of the Faculty of Applied Sciences.

This year A/L workshop was successfully conducted during 28th to 30th June under the guidance of Dean of the Faculty Dr. Ananda Karunaratna with the active participation of academic and non academic staff members and students. According to the organizing committee, more than 4000 Advanced Level students from 55 schools participated in this program.

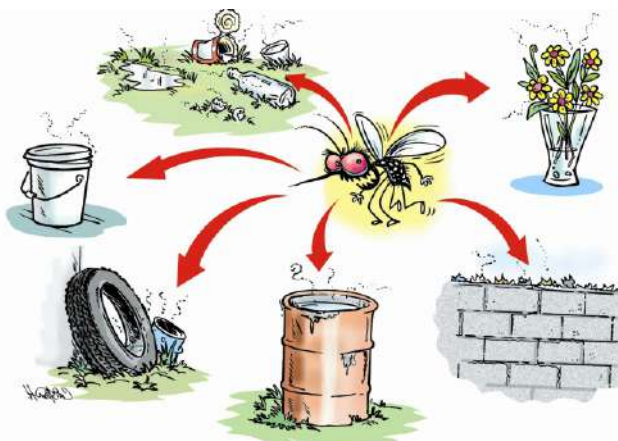


A Step Towards Dengue Free Future

Dengue is one of the fastest spreading infectious diseases of the 21st century as well as potentially fatal mosquito-borne disease. What compounds the situation is that there are no known drugs or vaccines against the dengue infection. As patterns of dengue change, it becomes more difficult to control. It requires effort from everyone at every level. However, community awareness and involvement is limited, and inter-sectorial collaboration is weak. More resources are needed to strengthen capacity and establish effective and dedicated dengue control programmes at national and sub-national levels, to detect and protect against both the virus and the vector at grassroot level. So, as a step towards the dengue free future, The Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Medicine and Allied Sciences, RUSL, conducted a community awareness programme and a dengue awareness lecture session.

Community Awareness Programme on Dengue

This programme was planned in view of increasing the awareness of Dengue among the general public. It was carried out in the Primary Health Clinic, Puliyankulama on the 7th of June 2017. A leaflet on various aspects of dengue was distributed among the participants, and Dr. Shoba Gunathilake, Lecturer, Department of Microbiology and Mrs. Amila Rathnayake, Entomologist of RDHS, Anuradhapura educated the public on the same.

Dissemination Workshop of Implementation Research Training Programme

Department of Community Medicine, Faculty of Medicine and Allied Sciences, Rajarata University of Sri Lanka completed 12 month training programme to train Sri Lankan health professionals and academics on Implementation Research. **The final workshop for dissemination of results was successfully conducted** on 2nd June 2017 in Anuradhapura.

The topics presented were Improving TB screening in Anuradhapura district, feasibility of adopting a protocol on Tuberculosis contact screening for Kurunegala district Tuberculosis Control Programme, identifying the gaps in notification of Leishmaniasis in health institutions in Nuwaragampalatha East MOH area, Identifying the barriers of Zinc supplementation programme in children with acute diarrhoea less than 5 years in Teaching Hospital Kandy and identifying the barriers to early treatment of suspected Leptospirosis patients in Nikeweratiya MOH area.

This training programme was granted through World Health Organization for “**Short-term training grants for research capacity strengthening and knowledge management (2015)**”. The training programme was completed with six groups of researchers representing North Central, North Western and Central provinces.



Green Concept for the Rajarata University Solid Waste Management Plan Proposed by the Department of Environmental Management

The Department of Environmental Management has proposed a waste management plan for the university system with the aim of “reducing the volume of waste, and the associated carbon emissions, produced by the University, by implementing waste reduction, reuse, recycling and recovery initiatives” in collaboration with Central Environmental Authority.

Construction of the compost yard for the university is being planned in collaboration with the Rajarata University and Central Environmental Authority.



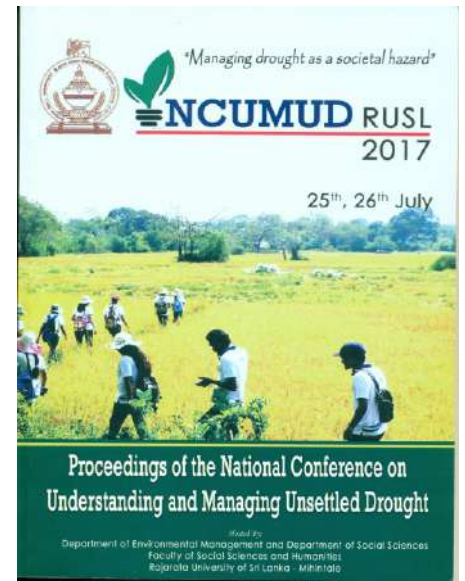
Excellent International Student Award

The National Conference on Understanding and Managing Unsettled Drought-2017

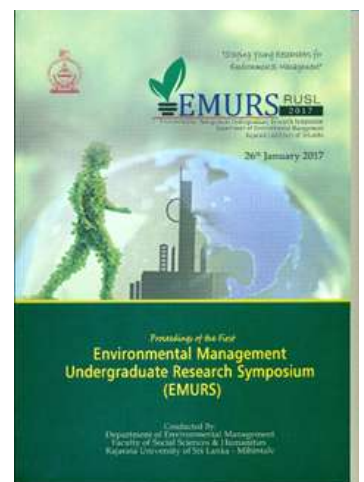
