State or non-state organizations should intervene to show their cultures in front of tourists. The people of Dimbulagala village should be given knowledge about hospitality management. Similarly, tourists should be allowed to try things like Udesa water sports in the vicinity of Dimbulagala Lake. By considering all these details, the historical place called Dimbulagala can attract tourists from home and abroad.
